- Sourcing team (execute tenders and IDIQs)
- Fulfillment team (issue purchase orders through ARTMIS; QA coordination as required)
- Delivery/Return team (organize freight and shipping)
- Finance team (process invoice payment)

With Whom Do I Speak?

- Single focal point within GHSC-PSM departments
- Escalation to Supplier Management team
- Field office versus HQ (what is TLP?)

Key to GHSC-PSM Operations

LMIS: Supplier portal used to:

- Receive order notification
- Update production and delivery schedule
- Submit key documentation
- Book freight
- Submit invoices (new feature!)



Emptoris: Supplier portal used to:

- Source events (IDIQs and spot tenders)
- Provide notification of RFX results
- Obtain e-signatures for subcontracts

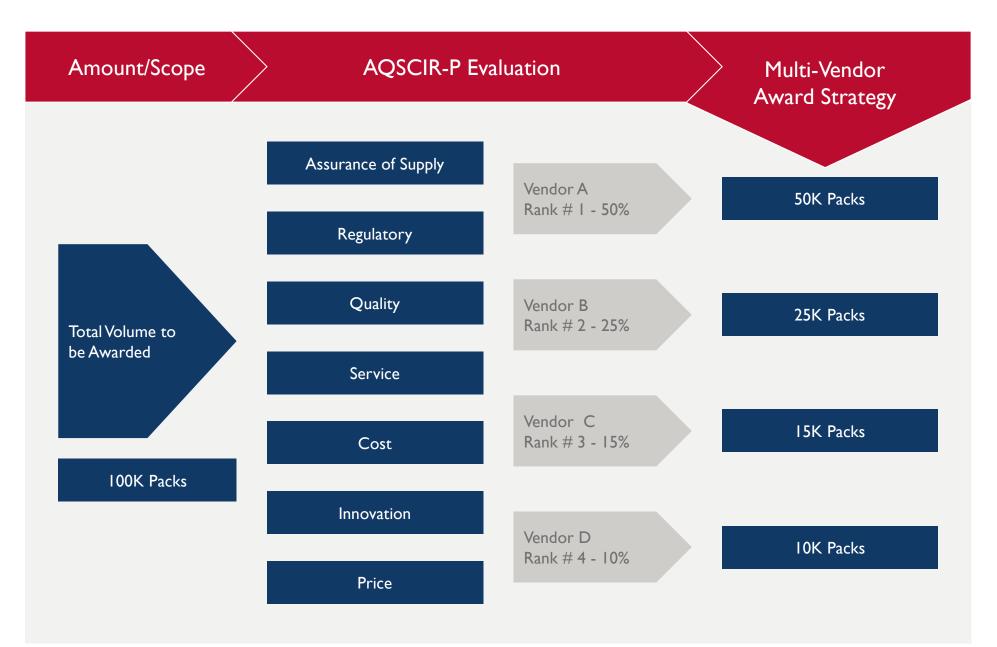

QUARTERLY EVALUATIONS BY TASK ORDER

- Tiered approach to evaluation
- All suppliers with LTAs, IDIQs, BPAs
- All USAID-approved wholesalers
- All suppliers that represent a significant spend
- Information will be shared with suppliers to remedy any performance issues





SCORECARD METRICS

Product Quality	40%	- Percentage of POs with and out of specification		
Order Fulfillment	30%	 Were the goods supplied in the right quantities? Were the goods made available on time? 		
Invoicing	10%	- Were the goods invoiced correctly?		
Service	I 0%	 Are the suppliers responsive to communications? Ease of doing business? Does the supplier offer after-sales service or in-country support (i.e., lab supplies, vehicles)? 		
Innovation	10%	- Is the supplier innovative in its supply chain and/or business processes?
