HOW TO WIN BUSINESS FOR NEW SUPPLIERS



CRITERIA TO BE CONSIDERED A GHSC-PSM SUPPLIER



Eligibility

Supplier must be compliant with U.S. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), 22 CFR 228, source/country of origin of the manufacturer



Quality Assurance (QA) Requirements

 Supplier/product must adhere to the GHSC quality requirements (GHSC-QA list of eligible suppliers/products, USFDA, SRA, WHO PQ, cGMPs, ISO)



Product Registration (when required)

 Supplier must have a valid registration from the local National Drug Regulatory Authority (NDRA)



HIV/AIDS QA

Commodity	Requirements
Pharmaceuticals (ARVs, essential medicines)	Must comply with Automated Directive System (ADS) 312 from the USAID Global Health Bureau https://www.usaid.gov/sites/default/files/documents/l864/ADS312AdditionalHelpDocument.pdf
Non-pharmaceutical products (VMMC, RUTF, lab supplies, and reagents)	Must adhere with GHSC-QA requirements for quality assurance and comply with International Standards, such as European Standards (CE), International Organization for Standardization (ISO, including applicable standard number), World Health Organization, and/or Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP) standards

Commodity	Eligibility Requirements
Antimalarial medicines	Stringent Regulatory Authority (SRA) https://www.usaid.gov/sites/default/files/documents/18 64/ADS312AdditionalHelpDocument.pdf
	World Health Organization (WHO) prequalified
	USAID preapproved wholesaler
RDTs	 The Plasmodium falciparum (PF) panel detection score at least 75% at 200 parasites μl. The Plasmodium vivax (P.vivax) panel detection score at least 75% at 200 parasites μl. The false-positive rate should be less than 10%. The invalid rate should be less than 5%
LLINs	World Health Organization Pesticide Evaluation Scheme (WHOPES) Phase II



REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH QA

Commodity	Eligibility Requirements
Oral contraceptives, injectables, and IUDs	US Food and Drug Administration (510K approval) Stringent Regulatory Authority (SRA) WHO Prequalified
Male condoms, female condoms, and lubricants	US Food and Drug Administration (510K approval)



QA POCS FOR SUPPLIER REGISTRATION


- FHI 360 is responsible for the QA/QC component for health commodities associated with HIV/AIDS (TOI), Reproductive Health and Family Planning (TO3), and Maternal Child Health and Zika (TO4).
- SGS is responsible for the QA/QC component for health commodities associated with malaria (TO2).


2017 GHSC-PSM SOURCING SCHEDULE




HIV/AIDS SOURCING CALENDAR



CONDOMS AND LUBRICANTS SOURCING CALENDAR




MALARIA SOURCING CALENDAR




EVALUATION CRITERIA (AQSCIR-P)

Production capacity Assurance of Supply Quantity in stock (when required) Past performance Administrative requirements Regulatory Registration in country Criteria and QA requirements (USFDA, WHO, GHSC-QA) Quality Shelf life percent weights Stability studies/climatic zone standards are tailored to Lead time (stock, fresh production) the commodity Service Customer service and/or product Product identification and specific sourcing Specific/unique label language Cost Unique distribution requirements strategy Serialization Innovation Packaging optimization New/improved products Price FCA unit price
